

# Burn Stewart Distillers Wins Gold (Best of Class)

In total, a gold and silver (best in class), 9 silver medals and three bronze medals have been awarded. Winning an award at the IWSC is a great achievement and this has been another record-breaking year for the Competition, now in its 38th year.

Black Bottle 10 year old Blended Scotch Whisky won the gold medal (Best in Class), with the Deanston 30 year old Highland Single Malt Scotch Whisky winning a Silver medal (Best in Class) and the malts, Ledaig 10 year old, Deanston 12 year old, Bunnahabhain 12 and 18 year old, winning silvers. The Scottish Leader 14, 15 and 21 year old Blended Malts and Scottish Leader and Black Bottle Blended Scotch Whiskies were also all recipients of silver medals in the competition. The Tobermory 10 year old and Bunnahabhain 25 year old malts, together with the Scottish Leader Blended Malt (unaged) were bronze medal winners.
